

Health Resources and Services Administration



- Supports more than 90 programs that provide health care to people who are geographically isolated, economically or medically vulnerable
- HRSA does this through grants and cooperative agreements to more than 3,000 awardees, including community and faith-based organizations, colleges and universities, hospitals, state, local, and tribal governments, and private entities
- Every year, HRSA programs serve tens of millions of people, including people living with HIV/AIDS, pregnant women, mothers and their families, and those otherwise unable to access quality health care







Bureau of Health Workforce (BHW)

- BHW improves the health of underserved populations by strengthening the health workforce and connecting skilled professionals to communities in need.
- We approach our grant awards, loan repayment, and scholarship programs as a continuum of education, training and service.
- Following this approach, we work to create a well-distributed and robust workforce supply of diverse, culturally competent health professionals who provide quality health care in high-need areas of the U.S. and its territories.
- Specifically, our scholarship and loan repayment programs help underserved communities recruit and retain primary health care providers.

 $\mathbf{28\%}$ of BHW funding supports the NHSC and other programs that improve the distribution of health professionals to underserved areas.





Overview



About Nurse Corps

The Nurse Corps offers programs to help address shortages of nurses across the country. These include:

- loan repayment to nurses who work in facilities experiencing a critical shortage of nurses;
- loan repayment to nurse faculty; and
- scholarships to students enrolled—or accepted for enrollment—in nursing degree programs.







Nurse Corps Field Strength



- The Nurse Corps program helps alleviate the critical shortage of nurses in highneed areas across the U.S. and its territories.
- Currently, there are more than 3,900 Nurse Corps participants serving at over 2,500 sites.
- Nurse Corps participants provide care to more than 4 million patients annually in urban, rural, and tribal areas.
- About 23% of our Nurse Corps clinicians work at a community health center or a community health center look-alike.



The Nurse Corps offers loan repayment to nurses who work in health centers, rural health clinics, hospitals, and other facilities experiencing a critical shortage of nurses; and to nurse faculty who teach full-time in eligible public or private schools of nursing.



LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM



You may be eligible for loan repayment if:

You are:

- a licensed registered nurse;
- an advanced practice registered nurse, such as a nurse practitioner; or
- a nurse faculty member with qualifying nursing debt;

You received your nursing education from:

• an accredited school of nursing located in a U.S. state or territory.

You work full-time at:

- an eligible Critical Shortage Facility (CSF) in a high need area (for RNs, APNs),
- an accredited school of nursing (for nurse faculty).



2-Year minimum With an optional 3rd year



- If awarded, you can pay off up to 85% of your nursing education debt. The program will award 60% of your unpaid nursing student loans in exchange for two years of service.
- If you commit to a third year of service, we will award an additional 25% of your original balance.


Half of all LRP awards are set aside for nurse practitioners (NPs), who are a critical part of the U.S. primary care workforce.

Of the 50 percent allocated for NPs, up to 20 percent are available for NPs practicing in a psychiatric-mental or behavioral health care capacity.

These allocations expand the integration of mental health, substance use disorder treatment, and other behavioral health services into primary care across the nation.



Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (1 of 4)



The Nurse Corps offers scholarships to nursing degree students who commit to practice at health care facilities with a critical shortage of nurses upon graduation.



Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (2 of 4)

- You may be eligible for a scholarship if you are a student accepted or enrolled in a diploma, associate, baccalaureate, or graduate degree nursing program.
- In exchange, you must work at an eligible facility with a critical shortage of nurses—a Critical Shortage Facility (CSF)—upon graduation.

Maximum of 4 YEARS of Support



Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (3 of 4)


Nurse Corps scholarships cover the following costs:

- tuition;
- eligible fees;
- annual payment for other reasonable costs, such as books, clinical supplies/instruments and uniforms; and
- a monthly stipend.

Maximum of 4 YEARS of Support



Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (4 of 4)




The Nurse Corps Scholarship Program offers a funding preference for applicants with the greatest financial need.

We determine an applicant's financial need based on the Expected Family Contribution generated through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).



2022 Award Cycle



- Nurse Corps Loan Repayment Program
 - (\$94.1 million) provided 2,071 new awards and 208 one-year continuation awards to nurses in exchange for a commitment to serve at a health care facility with a critical shortage of nurses or serve as nurse faculty at an accredited school of nursing.

Nurse Corps Scholarship Program

(\$58.9 million) provided 567 new awards and 25 continuation awards to nursing students in exchange for a commitment to work at least two years in a facility with critical shortages.

- Help clinicians pay off their health professional student loan debt in exchange for their service in high-need areas through scholarships and loan repayment programs.











Impact of the NHSC: Largest class in program history




- In 2021, we awarded every eligible applicant making this our largest class of clinicians ever.

General Loan Repayment Program Eligibility Requirements

Eligibility



U.S. citizen or national



Currently work, or applying to work, at an NHSC-approved site



Have unpaid government or commercial loans for school tuition, reasonable educational costs, and reasonable living expenses, segregated from all other debts



Licensed to practice in state where employer site is located

Must be licensed in one of the following eligible disciplines:

- Physician (MD or DO)
- Nurse practitioner (primary care)
- Certified nurse-midwife
- · Physician assistant
- Dentist (general or pediatric)

- Registered dental hygienist
- Psychiatrist
- Psychologist (health service)
- · Licensed clinical social worker
- Psychiatric nurse specialist
- Marriage and family therapist
- Licensed professional counselor
- Registered nurse
- Pharmacist
- Substance use disorder counselor
- Nurse anesthetist



Students to Service Loan Repayment Program

Eligibility



U.S. citizen or national



Full-time student in the final year at an accredited school, pursuing a degree in medicine* (MD or DO), dentistry** (DMD or DDS), nursing*** (NP or CNM), or physician assistant*** (PA)



Have unpaid government or commercial loans for school tuition, reasonable educational expenses, and reasonable living expenses, segregated from all other debts

Postgraduate Training Requirements

*Physicians (MD or DO): Must complete an accredited primary medical care residency in an NHSC-approved specialty

✓ Internal Medicine, Family Practice, Pediatrics, OB/GYN, Psychiatry, Geriatrics.

**Dentists (DMD or DDS): Encouraged (but not required) to complete an accredited postgraduate training in an NHSC-approved specialty

General Practice, Advanced Education in General Dentistry, Pediatric Dentistry, Public Health Dentistry, Geriatrics Dentistry Fellowship.

***Nurse Practitioners (NP), Certified Nurse Midwives and Physician Assistants: Encouraged (but not required) to complete an accredited postgraduate training in an NHSC-approved specialty.

✓ A one-year postgraduate training in a primary care specialty



Scholarship Program

Eligibility



U.S. citizen or national



Full-time student at an accredited school, pursuing a degree in: Medicine (DO or MD) Dentistry (DMD or DDS) Nurse practitioner Certified nurse-midwife Physician assistant (primary care)



Physicians are required to complete postgraduate training in an accredited primary care program. Dentists, Advanced Practice Registered Nurses and Physician Assistants are encouraged (but not required) to complete an accredited postgraduate training in an NHSC-approved specialty.



*Scholarship pays tuition, a monthly stipend (taxable) and other reasonable educational and living expenses in exchange for a minimum of two (2) years of full-time service.

*Available up to 4 years



Other Loan Repayment Programs

Substance Use Disorder Treatment & Recovery Loan Repayment Program (STAR LRP)

- Awards up to \$250,000
- 6-Year service Commitment
- Must be trained and licensed to provide SUD treatment at STAR LRP-approved SUD treatment facilities.
- Expands the eligible pool of disciplines and treatment facilities and supports SUD treatment. teams.

Pediatric Specialty Loan Repayment Program

SEC. 775 of the PHS Act (42 U.S. Code § 295f) Investment in Tomorrow's Pediatric Health Care Workforce authorizes the Secretary to establish and carry out a pediatric specialty loan repayment program (LRP).

- Further Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022 allows for a budget of \$5M for awards.
- Award Amount: Pending approval
- Eligible disciplines include but are not limited to:
 - Child and adolescent mental and behavioral health providers (specialized training or clinical experience in child and adolescent mental health);
 - Pediatric medical specialists and pediatric surgical specialists.



Support & Resources – Approved Sites

NHSC-Approved Sites

- NHSC clinicians serve at approved sites throughout the nation.
- NHSC-approved sites are outpatient facilities providing primary care medical, dental, and/or mental and behavioral health services.
- The facility may be located in a rural, urban or tribal community.
- To apply to become an NHSC site, the facility must be an <u>eligible site type</u> and meet applicable requirements.

Approved SUD Treatment Facilities

NHSC-Approved Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Eligible Treatment Facilities

To be an NHSC-approved SUD treatment facility, sites must have demonstrated that they meet the requirements set forth in the NHSC Site Agreement and NHSC Site Reference Guide, including submission of SUD documentation.

- SAMHSA-certified opioid treatment programs (OTPs)
- Office-based opioid treatment facilities (OBOTs)
- Non-opioid substance use disorder treatment facilities (SUD treatment facilities)
- Federally Qualified Health Care Centers (FQHCs)
- Rural Health Clinics (RHCs)
- American Indian Health facilities
- FQHC Look-Alikes

- State or federal correctional facilities
- Critical Access Hospitals
- Community health centers
- State or local health departments
- Community outpatient facilities
- Private practices






