- Additional behavioral health expansion in the 2023-2024 school year







#### **School-Based Dental**

- Access to dental care is provided to all students enrolled in the SB Dental Program
- Each enrollee receives Oral Hygiene Instructions and Nutritional Counseling regardless of insurance status
- Dental services may include:
  - Dental Screenings
  - Dental Cleanings
  - Fluoride Varnish Treatments
  - Dental Sealants
  - Dental Emergency Referrals
  - Oral Hygiene Instructions
  - Nutritional Counseling

#### **School-Based Dental**

- Enrollees are encouraged to continue services with their regular dental home as often as recommended for x-rays and periodic exams
- Referrals for emergency dental care due to pain and/or abscess(es) are given the option to be seen in one of Choptank's Dental Clinics or with their established dental home
- Three Choptank School-Based dental teams

#### Integrated SBHC Behavioral Health

**Funding** for integrated School-based behavioral health services was obtained and services began in Caroline County during the 2022/2023 school year.

#### Expanding services in 2022/2023:

Caroline County- 2 school-based Behavioral health teams

Talbot County- 2 school-based Behavioral health teams

#### Expanding services in 2023/2024:

Caroline County- a 3rd school-based Behavioral health team and a Community Health Worker (CHW)

Queen Annes County- integrated Behavioral health at 3 current schools, and 2 additional sites

- 2 Behavioral Health therapists (one specializing in music therapy)

Kent County- integrated Behavioral health at current SBHC location, and 2 additional school sites

**Referral process:** Internal Referrals up as much as 75% in some schools post-pandemic. Students must be enrolled in the SBHC program. Integrated into the services provided in the schools with referrals from the guidance counselors and administration.

Common reasons for referral: symptoms of anxiety, ADHD, or depression, behavioral concerns, trauma, grief



#### School-Based Behavioral Health

#### SBHC Behavioral Health Process:

- Referral is made
- Intake with Parent/guardian and student
- Patient is scheduled for ongoing appointments (weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly)

#### **Benefits:**


- Convenient (eliminates transportation issues/missed appointments)
- Available for crisis intervention within the school
- Provider works with patient, parent/guardian, and teachers/school staff on goals/objectives for home and school



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### CHOPTANK community health





- In 2022 CCHS purchased the first Mobile Health Unit
- MHU provides easier access to dental care; especially in public schools with limited space
- CCHS acquired two more MHU's in 2023 upon the success of MHU #1
- Utilized in all counties where services are provided
- Dental equipment is compact and portable, set up from school to school
- The amount of time spent at a school depends on the number of enrollments, ranging from two weeks to two months each school year



# School-Based Dental 2022-2023 Statistics

#### Caroline County Public Schools

- \* 1,180 enrollees seen for dental services
- ✤ 584 teeth sealed
- ✤ 455 enrollees with dental disease
- ✤ 23 enrollees needing emergent dental care

#### Dorchester County Public Schools

- \* 463 enrollees seen for dental services
- ✤ 630 teeth sealed
- \* 178 enrollees with dental disease
- \* 1 enrollees needing emergent dental care

Total Seen: 2,494 Total Teeth Sealed: 2,177

Total with Dental Disease: 893

Total needing Emergent Dental Care: 45

  - ✤ 337 enrollees seen for dental services
  - ✤ 444 teeth sealed
  - \* 115 enrollees with dental disease

- \* 160 teeth sealed

  - \* 70 enrollees with dental disease


