- Staffing model: 0.5 FTE Provider (NP and MD), 1 FTE MA, 1 FTE RN Manager, 1-2 FTE behavioral health, operational support from health sponsor

 - Rural and suburban
 - Diverse populations. Collaboration not competition!


- 8 School Based Health Centers
